International Education: Australia's Position

- More students are studying outside their home country
 2000: 2 million
 2012: 4 million
 - This growth is expected to continue over the next 10 years, to 2025
- Australia is a leading destination
- International education is a key sector in Australia
 - Second largest export sector
 - Year to June 2015: \$18.1 billion (up 15%)
- AIE2025 Market development plan for international education for next 10 years



Students from Taiwan

Still growing. Year to June 2015: 51,500 commencements (+29%)

Vocational: +47%

• ELICOS: +36%

- 78% go to Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria
 - QLD: 29% NSW: 27% VIC: 22%



Working Holiday Visas

- By country, Taiwan is amongst the top 4 countries whose citizens hold WHVs
- At December 2014, there were 23,000 WHVs held by Taiwanese citizens
