# A SUMMARY OVERVIEW OF THE CIC



The CIC is established by the CIC Act No 14 of 2013 with the mandate to;

- Regulate all aspects of the Construction industry.
- Promote and Develop the Construction Industry in Swaziland through:
  - Prioritising the award of construction contracts to local contractors with exceptions.
  - Joint venture and sub-contracting initiatives.
  - Training and Business Development.
- Register all Contractors;
- Register Construction Projects;
- Affiliate with bodies, institutions or organisations whose members are engaged in activities related to construction.



# A SUMMARY OVERVIEW OF THE CIC



According to the CIC Act a "contractor" means a person, or body of persons who undertake to execute and complete construction works.

"Construction works" means the provision of goods and or services for the development, extension, installation, repair, maintenance, renewal, removal, renovation, alteration, dismantling or demolition of a fixed asset including building and engineering infrastructure.

The Council registers both Swazi and Foreign companies.

## REGISTER OF PROJECTS



- 79 projects registered with the Council in the 2016/17 financial year with a total value of E4 654 270 080.68.
- 48 were public projects with a total value of E4 363 592 353,39,
- 31 private projects with a total value of E290 677 727,29.

Projects awarded and registered in the 2016/17 financial year amounted to a total of E2 202 868 436.23,

- public projects amounting to E1 991 384 418, 27 and
- private projects amounting to E211 484 017, 96.

Projects were dominant under the Swaziland National Housing Board (SNHB) through Government's Institutional Housing Project within the Public Sector and the Sugar Production Industry within the Private Sector.

Soon, the Levy Management System to be used for the registration of projects and include the register of contractors will be able to produce a detailed register of projects report according to the works discipline (building, civil works, etc.), construction firms, consultancy practices, category, suppliers, owner of the project.
